#### **Supporting Nurses' Well-Being: Health and Safety**

Supporting nurses' well-being begins with ensuring nurses feel safe in the workplace. Workplace violence and potential health risks associated with workplace violence is on the rise in health care. With health and safety of nurses an utmost priority for Bernadette Khan, DNP, RN, NEA-BC, Group Vice President and Chief Nursing Officer, NewYork-Presbyterian/Columbia University Irving Medical Center (NYP/Columbia) Division, she fully supported the acquisition of a panic button alarm system for the organization that spanned units with high rates of workplace violence incidents. A panic button alarm system is a concealed alarm that is wired to a monitoring system for emergency security services.

On April 24, 2023, Dr. Khan met with Aimee Rizzi, DNP, RN, CEN, Director of Nursing, Medicine; Edward M. McCabe, CPP, CFE, Director of Security; Rahiem Allen, Security Manager; and Danny Guzman, Security Manager; to discuss safety concerns identified by Dr. Rizzi and the nursing team. The following day, Dr. Rizzi emailed the group a summation of their meeting outlining next steps for a behavioral response team and a panic alarm button system. In support of nurses' well-being related to their health and safety, Dr. Khan replied that she would speak to Lauren L. Hill, MD, MBA, Group

### **Chief Nursing Officer Advocacy for a Panic Alarm System**

On May 5, 2023, Dr. Khan met with Dr. Hill and advocated for the funding of a panic button alarm system for the following areas that were experiencing high levels of workplace violence incidents: Medical (7GS-605161) [7GS], MICU (4HN-605420) [MICU], SICU (4HS-605152) [SICU], Medical Infectious Disease (6GS605110) [6GS], and Medical (6GN-605116) [6GN]. During the meeting with Dr. Hill, Dr. Khan explained that prioritizing the health and safety of nurses has a positive impact on engagement and patient outcomes as well as supports the organization's commitment to zero workplace harm, an organizational priority. As a result of Dr. Khan's advocacy, Dr. Hill fully supported funding for the panic button alarm system. [TL5a.2—1:1 Meeting Notes](#)

### **Acquisition of a Panic Alarm System**

Evan Odeseye, PMP, Nursing Project Manager, accepted Dr. Khan's assignment to lead the acquisition and installation for the employee safety panic buttons. On May 12, 2023, Dr. Khan reviewed and approved a proposal for two desk mounted panic alarm buttons from LPC, Inc. Mr. Odeseye then sent a purchase on June 22, 2023, for the purchase of the panic alarms. [TL5a.3—Panic Alarm Proposal and Purchase Order](#)

Since panic alarms are wired to a monitoring system, during May 2023, Dr. Khan also reviewed and approved a proposal for the wiring supplies and installation costs associated with the panic alarm system from Alan Joel Communications. Mr. Odeseye submitted a purchase order on July 3, 2023 for the supplies and installation needs for the panic button system. [TL5a.4—Cable Wiring for Panic Alarms Proposal and Purchase Order](#)

By October 3, 2023, the panic button alarm system was installed and functioning on all units (7GS, MICU, SICU, 6GS, and 6GN). This well-being initiative prioritized the health and safety of nurses. Due to Dr. Khan's prioritization and advocacy for the prevention of real and potential threats of workplace violence, the nurses felt supported in a safe nursing practice environment. Meet with Nursing Professional Development to review learning modules and discuss dissemination of education

Regroup with this team in one month.
