Comments from COA-PTP:

The submission did not address how academic collaborations help achieve program goals. New York Presbyterian academic collaborative efforts are remarkable. It would be valuable to see academic efforts can be specifically tied to the residency program goals in future.

Appraiser Comments

Discussion of applicant RN Residency/RN or APRN Fellowship Program strengths:

- The strengths of the program include the communication between the SCCs and the leadership. Even with multiple sites, leaders are kept well-informed.
- The role of the TTP Coach seems to have great potential. This should be considered for a future best practice.
- Additionally, the EBP project seems to be well received by their residents. The residents discussion of their projects elicit sense of pride and empowerment.
- The Weekly Clinical Feedback Tool was discussed many times and the residents spoke positively about the use of the process.

Discussion of applicant RN Residency/RN or APRN Fellowship Program areas for improvement:

- The areas for program improvement the development of a formal preceptor feedback/evaluation process to increase consistency across the sites.
- Consider developing a process to regularly inform and communicate specifically with the preceptor group (stakeholders) related to the program goals and quality outcomes.
- Consider strengthening the AIDET framework tool to establish consistency of use in the practice setting.

Does this applicant utilize a “best practice” that can and should be shared with others?

- A best practice includes the leadership involvement with a program from Mayor's office in New York City to role model to other hospitals around developing and implementing nurse residency programming.
